The purpose of these changes is to protect our environment from the costs associated with plastic. Research has been done on its negative effects on the environment, and I feel that our state can progress towards future environmental stability by finding alternatives to plastic.

Senate Bill 940: Hate Crim

Although Florida has a hate crime law, the current statute, however, needs to be strengthened and updated to protect ALL Floridians. This is why I filed this bill again. Hate crimes are distinct because they target victims simply for who they are and are intended to terrorize members of entire communities. Our hate crime law is a way for Florida to recognize that these crimes strike special fear within victimized individuals and groups. This legislation would expand the law's definition of disability; bring the Florida Hate Crime law into conformity with federal hate crime law; and cover "mixed-motive" hate crimes, which are currently not covered under Florida's hate crime law. Throughout Florida, there has been a 51 percent increase in the number of hate crimes reported to the FBI in 2017 compared to 2016.



This "bottle bill" implements a redemption program that would enable individuals to redeem bottles at a recycling center in return for a monitory deposit for each bottle. Currently, a number of states have such a program, some have been in existence for many decades. These programs have proven to increase the recycling rate. The program will not only help reduce litter, but will also help in combatting our struggle with a polluted environment.
