This Small Business Week, register to do business with the SWA

Small business owners – get ready to do business with the Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County (SWA)!

In June of last year, the SWA Governing Board adopted the Economic Inclusion Policy and Procedures, designed to promote equitable bid opportunities for small, local, minority and women-owned businesses (S/M/WBEs) and to eliminate barriers to their participation in SWA contracts.

"As a governmental agency, we strive to ensure that all businesses, including S/M/WBEs, have an equitable opportunity to participate in the procurement process and prime contract and subcontract opportunities," said Colleen Robbs, Director, SWA Equal Business Opportunity Office. "We encourage all small businesses to register as a vendor with the SWA, so they will be ready when bid opportunities arise."

Vendor Registration is free and provides businesses with bid notifications on upcoming purchasing opportunities. Businesses simply visit SWA.org/EBMS and click "Apply for Registration." If already a registered vendor, businesses will need to ensure that vendor information is

up-to-date. The SWA recognizes SBE or M/WBE certifications from all State of Florida governmental entities.

"From professional services, to engineering partnerships, to office supplies and promotional materials, the SWA purchases a wide variety of goods and services each year," Robbs said. "We hope that these purchases represent opportunities to businesses of all sizes."

We call ourselves AWAY: whether you throw it, recycle it or flush it AWAY, we put your waste to work. Each year, we:

- · Process almost 90,000 tons of recyclables<<u>http://www.swa.org/RecycleRight</u>> each year
- Burn approximately 1.8 million tons of trash each year to generate electricity at renewable energy facilities< http://swa.org/364/Renewable-Energy-Facilities>
- Produce enough electricity to power approximately 74,000 homes
- Recycle more than 150,000 tons of wastewater treatment residuals<http://swa.org/353/Biosolids-Processing-Facility> (sludge from flushes) into environmentally-friendly fertilizer
- · Safely dispose of more than 4.2 million pounds of home hazardshttp://swa.org/171/Home-Chemical-Disposal a year
- Collect water off of the roofs of Renewable Energy Facility 2<<u>http://swa.org/375/Palm-Beach-Renewable-Energy-Facility-2</u>> and store it in a 2 million gallon cistern, which is used as part of the energy making process
