

On Monday, July 1, 2019 the Honorable Emily Slosberg (D-Boca Raton) will join several fellow legislators, Florida Highway Patrol officers, community leaders and family members who have lost loved ones on Florida's roadways for a ceremonial signing and dedication of the Florida law that makes texting while driving a primary traffic offense. The dedication will be at the crash site in Boca Raton where Rep. Slosberg's twin sister and four friends were killed 23 years ago. Although Emily survived the crash, she and her family, like other victims and survivors, have lived with the tragedy every day since then.

Other participants will include Irving Slosberg, CEO of the *Dori Saves Lives Foundation*, as well as students and family members of those lost in car crashes.
