

This year PBCFR committed to revisit its Pet Safety Sticker Program by planning to reach out to the more than 350,000 homes in the county that house dogs and cats. Our plan is to distribute close to 150,000 thousand pet safety stickers that alert first responders that there are pets in the homes. I wear two hats--a member of the PBCFR Advisory Board and Vice president of the non profit, totally volunteer, 501-C charity organization, CAB Corp. that exclusively raises funds to purchase life saving equipment for PBCFR. CAB Corp has recently helped the county by paying for 100,000 pet safety stickers, saving the county over \$12,000. CAB Corp has already raised over \$320,000 for equipment and services for the fire dept.

Your help would be very valuable in helping us promote this program. We are trying to get as much community coverage as possible. My team has started been working with the PBC School System, restaurant chains such as Duffy's and Lucille's and Public to distribute these stickers to our county residents BUT we need to further our outreach and I believe you and Commissioner Weinroth can make a difference in our success.
