Recycled paint program revitalizes Palm Beach County properties

The Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County has provided thousands of gallons of recycled paint to residents in need of maintaining the exterior of their homes.

Your neighbors can once again get a one-time donation of this free, high-quality exterior latex house paint, choosing from 10 colors. We need your to help identify those residents in your community who would benefit from this opportunity.

To qualify for a one-time paint donation, recipients must:

- Reside in Palm Beach County
- Live in the home; owner-occupied
- Reside in a single-family home
- Have a home of 3,000 square feet or less

Qualifying residents can apply by visiting <u>swa.org/paint<https://swa.org/paint</u>> or by calling the Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County's Customer Services Team at 561-697-2700 or 866-SWA-INFO (866-792-4636) toll-free. If approved, the

recycled paint will be available for pick up in approximately four to six weeks. Applicants will be contacted when their paint is available.

Palm Beach County residents who have old paint to donate may visit any of the Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County's seven Home Chemical and Recycling Centers<<u>https://swa.org/hcrc</u>> and drop it off for free.

In the last fiscal year, Palm Beach County residents recycled 2,041,660 pounds of latex paint at the SWA's Home Chemical and Recycling Centers<<u>http://www.swa.org/HCRC</u>>. Each year, the SWA's Home Chemical and Recycling Centers either recycles or safely disposes of 4.2M pounds of household hazardous wastes.

About the SWA

The Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County is a Dependent Special District that was created by the Florida Legislature in 1975. Since then, the SWA has developed an award-winning integrated solid waste management system to handle the county's waste and recyclables. We call ourselves AWAY: whether you throw it, recycle it or flush it AWAY, we put your waste to work. Each year, we:

• Process almost 90,000 tons of recyclables<<u>http://www.swa.org/RecycleRight</u>> each year

• Burn approximately 1.8 million tons of trash each year to generate electricity at renewable energy facilities<<u>http://swa.org/364/Renewable-Energy-Facilities</u>>

• Produce enough electricity to power approximately 74,000 homes

• Recycle more than 150,000 tons of wastewater treatment residuals<<u>http://swa.org/353/Biosolids-Processing-Facility</u>> (sludge from flushes) into environmentally-friendly fertilizer

• Safely dispose of more than 4.2 million pounds of home hazards<<u>http://swa.org/171/Home-Chemical-Disposal</u>> a year

• Collect water off of the roofs of Renewable Energy Facility 2<<u>http://swa.org/375/Palm-Beach-Renewable-Energy-Facility-2</u>> and store it in a 2 million gallon cistern, which is used as part of the energy making process
