



- 532 search warrants filed and executed
- 156 firearms seized
- \$9.3 million in U.S. currency seized
- 25 vehicles seized
- More than 484 kilos of cocaine seized
- More than 36 kilos of heroin seized
- More than 1557 kilos of marijuana seized
- 1,111 marijuana plants seized
- 199,698 grams of THC oil seized
- 10,485 grams of synthetic drugs seized

Our Narcotics Division was awarded the “*Florida Narcotic Officers Statewide Unit of the Year*” by The Florida Narcotic Officers' Association. They worked more than 1600 high-level cases last year and were able to hold our agency to a high standard.

The Narcotics Division primary focus is to enforce state and federal controlled substance laws and regulations. Our fight against drug abuse continues. To report suspected illegal drug activity through the Narcotics Division Tip Line (561-688-4400) or calling Crime Stoppers (800-458-8477).

Our Explorers participated in the Las Vegas 2019 Excon Conference Competition hosted by Las Vegas PD and brought home a first place trophy in the category of "Unknown Trouble Incident" and 3rd place in "Crime Scene Investigation."

They also participated in the Florida Sheriff's Explorers Association state

conference and competition hosted by Osceola County Sheriff's Explorers. Needless to say, they brought home lots of awards, among them, "1st place in shooting competition, 2nd place in Traffic Stop, 2nd place in Building Search, 3rd place PAT course in the female division, 1st place in Crime Scene Investigation, 3rd place in Officer Down Scenario, 3rd place in Drill and ceremony competition. PBSO Explorers also brought back "Male and Female Southern Regional Explorer of the Year" awards, "Male and Female Leadership" awards and \$5,750.00 in scholarships.





PBSO Social Media Documentary **Sparks Lead** for the 35-Year-Old Case of **Christie Luna**

Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office Social Media Unit crafted a documentary earlier this year about the disappearance of Christy Luna, the 8-year-old little girl who went missing 35 years ago.

The Netflix-like documentary was the Unit's efforts to bring awareness to the case in a creative way. The strategy worked since it was shared on various social media platforms that it developed a valuable tip.

Detective William Springer, one of the original detectives on the case, followed up on the tip and believed that it was the best and most credible lead to date in the 35-year-old cold case.

On Monday, August 5th, 2019, a team of anthropologists from Florida Gulf Coast University enlisted to methodically check an area located close to where Christy was last seen, on 265 Swain Blvd, Greenacres. This place is right in front of Belk's General Store where she was last seen alive on 1984.

Today the search for Christy continues. If you have any information about the disappearance of Christie Luna, please call Detective Springer at 561-688-4013, Crime Stoppers at 1-800-458-TIPS or you can remain anonymous by downloading our app "Connect Protect." A reward of \$15,000 is being offered for any information regarding this case.



Using the online citizen police report system allows you to submit a report immediately and obtain an unofficial copy of the police report for your records.

To file a report online, email to onlinereporting@pbso.org

Ready to file an online police report?

Make sure you have the following information

- When the incident happened (date and time)
- Where the incident occurred (address, location and name of business)
- Who is reporting this incident (name, date of birth, contact information)
- Who is involved in this incident (name, date of birth, contact information)
- If this report involves property (make, model, serial number, description and estimated value of the property)

What to expect after you file your report

- You will see the words “your report has been submitted”. This means that your online report has been received by the Palm Beach County Sheriff’s Office online reporting system.
- Your report will automatically be assigned a Temporary Report Number. You will be able to immediately print a copy of the temporary report.
- All submitted reports will be reviewed. Upon review, you may be contacted if further information is needed.
- Once your police report has been approved, a PBSO case number will be issued and an unofficial report will be emailed to you.
- Should you need an official copy of your report, please contact PBSO Central Records at 561-688-3140.
- If your report is rejected. You will receive email notification with a reason for the rejection.






