

### LATEST OPERATIONAL UPDATES

#### **\*New\* Palm Beach County Issues Executive Order 20-004 Directive to Wear Facial Covers**

Palm Beach County issued Emergency Order 20-004 effective April 13, 2020 which states all persons working in, patronizing, or otherwise physically present in grocery stores, restaurants, pharmacies, construction sites, public transit vehicles, vehicles for hire, and locations where social distancing measures are not possible should wear facial coverings as defined by the CDC. *All other persons physically present in any public place in Palm Beach County are strongly urged to wear facial coverings as defined by the CDC.*

A facial covering includes any covering which snugly covers the lower face, nose, and mouth, whether store bought or homemade

mask, or clothing covering, including but not limited to, a scarf, bandana, handkerchief or other similar cloth covering and which is secured in place.

Examples of compliant homemade facial coverings may be found on the CDC website: [CDC Face Coverings](#). Persons wearing facial coverings should review the CDC and Florida Department of Health guidelines regarding safely applying, removing, and cleaning facial coverings.

Persons utilizing facial coverings should not procure surgical masks or N95 rated masks, as those are critical supplies for health care workers, law enforcement, fire-rescue, emergency management, or other persons engaged in life and safety activities.

### **\*New\* Testing Sites Summary**

#### **South County Civic Center-Cleveland Clinic Florida**

During the eighth day of drive-thru testing for COVID-19 at the South County Civic Center, Cleveland Clinic Florida tested 152 patients. The Cleveland Clinic Florida COVID-19 Screening Center representatives have scheduled 92 appointments so far for Tuesday. Appointments can be made at 561-804-0250. You must call to be screened and confirm an appointment time.

#### **Health Care District of Palm Beach County-FITTEAM Ballpark of the Palm Beaches**

During the 14th day of drive-thru testing for COVID-19 in Palm Beach County, the Health Care District of Palm Beach County's C. L. Brumback Primary Clinics tested 420 patients at the FITTEAM Ballpark of the Palm Beaches in West Palm Beach. There were 73 patients who did not show for their scheduled appointments. The average age of the patients tested was 55. A total of 14 children were tested and the youngest patient was two years old. Patients are notified when their results

are in. A total of 5,813 tests have been administered at the site since it opened on March 31<sup>st</sup>.

The Health Care District's Testing Hotline, 561-642-1000, reopens at 8 a.m. tomorrow to continue filling 1,000 available appointments for Friday and Saturday. The Health Care District's C. L. Brumback Primary Care Clinics' staff who are conducting the testing, along with on-site Palm Beach County staff and members of the Florida Army National Guard, thank patients for their understanding in this hot weather and appreciate their messages of support at the drive-thru site.

### **Cleveland Clinic Florida Testing**

Cleveland Clinic Florida has **expanded criteria** for individuals eligible for COVID-19 testing. Anyone over the age of 16 who has the following signs and symptoms will be eligible for testing at our South Palm Beach County drive-through location:

- Fever and respiratory illness (such as cough, shortness of breath, runny nose)
- Fever and gastrointestinal illness (such as diarrhea, vomiting)

Individuals must still call first to speak with a nurse to ensure they meet criteria and make an appointment for testing at 561.804.0250.

### **Belle Glade COVID-19 Testing**

COVID-19 testing is available on a walk-up basis outside of the Primary Care Clinic at Lakeside Medical Center. Hours of operation are Monday – Friday 9:00 am – 2:00 pm. Individuals who believe they are exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 and would like to be tested are invited to walk up and see a provider for screening. If the provider determines they are a candidate for screening, they will be registered on-site and tested. Results will

be communicated by a Health Care District provider as soon as they are available.

## **School Information**

The Palm Beach County School District announced that Palm Beach County schools will remain closed until further notice.

The School District of Palm Beach County continues its commitment to feeding students while schools are closed. Thirty-

five sites across Palm Beach County are distributing ‘Grab and Go’ meal bags.

**\*New\*** Starting Monday, April 13 and until further notice, the 35 feeding sites will be open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Two days' worth of meals will be provided each day.

Meals are FREE to anyone under 18 years of age (under 22 for ESE students), regardless of financial need.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has provided a waiver to allow parents/guardians to pick up meals without the child being present. The parent needs to provide confirmation of the number of children for which they are picking up meals, by one of the following methods: student ID, student passport,

student library card, student birth certificate, or a photo of the adult picking up the meals with the students for whom they are picking up meals.

The parent will show the identification to staff providing the meals, and meals will be provided for the number of children identified. The District follows food distribution rules as outlined by the USDA.

To limit person-to-person contact, please remember to adhere to social distancing. Those driving to one of the feeding sites are asked to open the trunk of their car or leave a seat open where staff can place the food. People walking up to a site should remember to maintain a distance of at least six feet. These measures are taken very seriously and are intended to keep everyone safe.

Meals provided may vary by location and may contain allergens. Adults picking up the food are asked to be vigilant and ensure they do not take food if allergies may be a concern. Food should be refrigerated or discarded if not consumed upon receipt.

## Landscape & lawn watering restrictions issued

The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) issued an order on water conservation measures with strict guidelines to property owners to follow irrigation schedules that conserve water amid drier than average conditions.

The District has lawn watering restrictions all year. Amid recent dry conditions, property owners should take additional measures to conserve water including:

- Water lawns only two days per week between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Apply no more than 3/4-inch to 1 inch of water per week on their lawns and landscapes and only as needed to supplement rainfall.

**Division of Corporations Annual Reports Filing Extension.** The annual report filing deadline for Florida business entities has been suspended until June 30, 2020 per [Department of State Emergency Order 2020-01](#). This includes any corporation, limited liability company, limited partnership or limited liability limited partnership entities required to file an annual report with the Florida Division of Corporations. **Employee Paid Leave Rights.** Effective April 1, 2020, the federal Families First Coronavirus Response Act requires private employers with 500 employees or less to provide employees with paid sick leave or expanded family and medical leave for specified reasons related to COVID-19. **Express Bridge Loan Pilot Program (Federal).** This pilot program allows SBA Express Lenders authority to deliver expedited SBA guaranteed financing on an emergency basis for disaster-related purposes to eligible small businesses, while the small businesses apply for and await long-term financing. **Paycheck Protection Program Loan Guarantee (Federal).** Starting April 10, 2020, independent contractors and self-employed individuals can apply for and receive loans to cover their payroll and other certain expenses through existing SBA lenders.

*Eligibility Criteria:* Eligible recipients may qualify for a loan up to \$10 million determined by 8 weeks of prior average payroll plus an additional 25% of that amount. Loan payments will be deferred for six months. If you maintain your workforce, SBA will forgive the portion of the loan proceeds that are used to cover the first 8 weeks of payroll and certain other expense following loan origination. **Short-Time Compensation Plans.** Employers can work with DEO to enter into short-time compensation plans. **Under such plans, employers reduce hours for a group of employees (no more than 40% reduction) instead of resorting to temporary layoffs. Partial benefits are paid to employees.** [Click here for more information.](#)

**Small Business Administration Economic Injury Disaster Loan or Loan Advance.** The SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program provides small businesses with working capital loans of up to \$2 million that can provide vital economic support to small businesses to help overcome the temporary loss of revenue they are experiencing. ## **Tax Support**

**State Tax-Related Support** Florida Department of Revenue (DOR) established a dedicated team to address tax-related issues pertaining to COVID-19 and created an email address, **COVID19TAXHELP@floridarevenue.com**, where taxpayers can send questions and concerns. The Department encourages all taxpayers to use e-services applications to file and pay taxes or contact the call center at 850-488-6800.

**State Property Taxes.** Property tax is normally due by March 31 in the year following the year the taxes are assessed. **The Department waived the due date so that payments remitted by April 15, 2020, for the 2019 tax year will be considered timely paid.** Property taxpayers should contact their county property appraisers and tax collectors for information.

## **Veteran Support**

**Veteran Employment Assistance.** Veterans Florida provides resume assistance and job placement for veterans and spouses seeking employment in Florida. ### Unemployment Insurance

More laid-off and furloughed workers will be eligible for Unemployment Insurance and will see an additional \$600 per week to match the average paycheck for up to 4 months of benefits. For a list of unemployment offices by state please [click here](#).

### Direct Payments to Individuals and Their Families

Individuals making up to \$75,000 (\$150,000 for married workers) will receive payments of \$1,200 with an additional \$500 payment per minor child. The payments decrease ratably and stop altogether for single workers making more than \$99,000 (\$198,000 for married workers and \$218,000 for a family of four).

These payments will be issued by the IRS via direct deposit and will be based on 2019 or 2018 tax return or 2019 Social Security statement.

If someone has not filed a tax return in 2018 or 2019 and does not receive Social Security benefits, the IRS recommends filing a 2018 return to receive payment. If the IRS does not have the taxpayer's bank account information, the taxpayer should look for a letter from the IRS detailing how to receive their payment.

If you receive Social Security, retirement or other social safety net benefits, you may still qualify for direct payments. For more information from the IRS click [here](#).

## Food Assistance

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), more commonly known as food stamps, ensures that Americans receive the food they need, especially if they are newly unemployed. Congress has invested in SNAP in the last three bills to help Americans put food on the table during this crisis. ## Food Banks

Congress has now secured \$850 million in emergency funding for The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) to help food banks face increased utilization and demand in countless communities across the country due to the coronavirus.

## Homeowners and Renters Protection

**Mortgage Forbearance:** Homeowners with FHA, USDA, VA, or Section 184 or 184A mortgages (for members of federally-recognized tribes) and those with mortgages backed by Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac have the right to request forbearance on their payments for up to 6 months, with a possible extension for another 6 months without fees, penalties, or extra interest. **Homeowners should contact their mortgage servicing company directly.**

**Eviction Protections:** Renters residing in public or assisted housing, or in a home or apartment whose owner has a federally-backed mortgage, and who are unable to pay their rent, are protected from eviction for 4 months. Property owners are also prohibited from issuing a 30-day notice to a tenant to vacate a property until after the 4-month moratorium ends. This protection covers properties that receive federal subsidies such as public housing, Section 8 assistance, USDA rural housing programs, and federally-issued or guaranteed mortgages. **Renters whose landlord is not abiding by the moratorium should contact the relevant federal agency that administers their housing program or their local Legal Aid office.**

## **Energy Assistance for Low Income Families**

## **Emergency Paid Leave**

Many workers in America currently have no paid leave and are being forced to choose between their paycheck, their health, and the health of the people around them.

The emergency paid leave provisions passed by Congress and signed into law by the President are a critical step toward protecting families' financial security and mitigating the spread of the coronavirus. Below is information on eligibility for emergency paid sick leave and paid family leave.

## **Small Businesses Forgivable Loans and Grants**

Congress secured \$350 billion in forgivable loans and \$10 billion in grants to small businesses, tribal business concerns, and certain nonprofits.

Loans through a new SBA 7(a) Paycheck Protection Program can be forgiven when used for payroll costs (including paid leave, health care, and other costs) to retain workers, and other expenses such as rent, mortgage interest, and utilities. Independent contractors, sole-proprietors, and other self-employed persons are eligible for these loans.

Small businesses can also apply for up to \$10,000 in grants to retain workers and pay for debt obligations.

Small businesses, tribal business concerns, 501(c)(3) nonprofits, and 501(c)(19) veterans organizations in your district should contact their lender and the Small Business Administration office directly.

## **Paid Sick and Family Leave Tax Credit**

Employers who provide required leave to their employees and who employ less than 500 employees are eligible for a tax credit to offset the costs of such leave. This tax relief will be provided against quarterly payroll taxes (those paid in connection with the Form 941). For additional guidance, please refer to the IRS's [website](#).

## **Medium-Sized Businesses**

Included in the bill is a fund administered by Secretary Mnuchin designed to provide low-interest bank financing to medium-sized businesses and nonprofits with 500 to 10,000 employees. As of now, we do not have information about the protocols for the administration of this fund. As soon as we have this information we will provide it to you.

## **Student Loan Relief for Borrowers**

If you have student loan debt, Congress secured several options outlined below for borrowers that help provide relief through September 30, 2020. During this period, a borrower will be able to:

- Pause payments for federal student loan borrowers who have Direct Loans and Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL), which means these borrowers will not be required to make any payments toward outstanding interest or principal balance.
- Suspend interest accrual for such loans so that these balances don't accrue.
- Avoid forced collections such as garnishment of wages, tax refunds, & Social Security benefits.
- Halt negative credit reporting
- Ensure a borrower continues to receive credit toward Public Service Loan Forgiveness, Income-Driven Repayment forgiveness, and loan rehabilitation.
