DEO UPDATE

HOW TO USE A MASK?



PUTTING ON YOUR MASK SAFELY



- Begin by washing your hands prior to putting on the face-covering
- Be sure to place it over your nose and mouth, but also secure it under your chin
- It should fit snugly against the sides of your face
- Most importantly, make sure you can breathe easily

REMOVING YOUR MASK SAFELY



- Either stretch the ear loops or untie the strings behind your head
- Only handle the mask by only the ear loops or ties
- Fold outside corners together
- Place covering in the washing machine (if it is a cloth mask)
- Be cautious not to touch your eyes, nose, and mouth when removing
- Wash your hands immediately after removing the mask

WASHING YOUR MASK BY HAND

- Begin by preparing a bleach solution by mixing: 5 tablespoons (1/3rd cup) household bleach per gallon of room temperature water or 4 teaspoons household bleach per quart of room temperature water
- Some bleach products, such as those designed for safe use on colored clothing, may not be suitable for disinfection. Therefore it is essential first to check the label to see if your bleach is intended for disinfection. Ensure the bleach product is not past its expiration date. (Never mix household bleach with ammonia or any other cleanser)
- Soak the face-covering in the bleach solution for 5 minutes
- Rinse thoroughly with cool or room temperature water
- Lay flat and allow to completely dry (if possible, place the cloth face-covering in direct sunlight)

WASHING YOUR MASK IN THE WASHING MACHINE/DRYER

- Cloth face-coverings should be washed after each use
- You can include your face covering with your regular laundry
- Use regular laundry detergent and the warmest appropriate water setting
- Place it in the dryer and use the highest heat setting (leave in the machine until it is completely dry)



BOTTOM LINE: USING THE FACE COVERING PROTECTS OTHERS

- While individuals that test positive for COVID-19 should be isolating at home, the virus can be spread by those that are asymptomatic and unaware that they have it. This is why the CDC recommends wearing a mask and social distancing (staying 6 feet away from others) in public settings. It is currently the most effective way to protect yourself and others as the mask will provide an extra layer of prevention against the respiratory droplets which spread the virus.
- Please keep the covering on your face the entire time you're in public (such as grocery stores, pharmacies, and gas stations)
- Do not move the covering around your neck or up on your forehead
- Don't touch the face covering, and, if you do, wash your hands
- Wearing a mask or face covering slows the spread of the virus and helps people who might unknowingly be positive from transmitting it to others.
