# Rapid COVID-19 testing available

Rapid antigen testing is now available at the FITTEAM Ballpark of the Palm Beaches for anyone 65 years of age or older, 18 years of age or younger, or anyone showing symptoms of COVID-19. Appointments are required. Registration can be done online at <a href="https://www.tourhealth.com">www.tourhealth.com</a> or by calling (866) 416-6341. Online scheduling is preferred.

**New Amazon distribution center** 

The county recently announced plans for a new one-millionsquare-foot Amazon distribution center. The new facility will bring hundreds of jobs in the areas of finance, human resources, security, IT, distribution, as well as packaging and shipping.

- The facility will be on 100 acres at 14490 Corporate Road North in the Palm Beach Park of Commerce.
- Completion date will be Fall of 2021.
- Site work is underway, and there will be hundreds of construction jobs.

The county has been working closely with the Business Development Board to finalize this project. One of the biggest factors in landing this project was the county's role in expedited permitting since the location is unincorporated which will also have a significant impact the county's property tax base.

## **Eviction mitigation assistance**

The county has partnered with the Legal Aid Society of Palm Beach County and is offering free assistance and representation with landlord/tenant matters and past due payments through the CARES Act Rapid Response Eviction Assistance Project (RREAP). The program term is from August 1 through December 30, 2020.

#### The services include:

- pre-suit mediation between landlords and tenants
- legal advice regarding the eviction process
- referrals for rental assistance
- preparation of responses to an eviction lawsuit

- · assistance in negotiating repayment plans, and
- court representation

# Mosquito-borne illness alert

The Florida Department of Health-Palm Beach County has issued a mosquito-borne illness alert for the county as a second human case of West Nile virus has been confirmed.

In response, the Palm Beach County Mosquito Control Division has increased aerial spraying covering over 280,000 acres of areas west of Military Trail from western Boca Raton north to Wellington, the Acreage/Loxahatchee, Jupiter Farms, and the Glades communities.

Some preventative measures you can take are:

- Remove standing water (garbage cans, house gutters, buckets, coolers, old tires, other containers)
- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated (empty plastic swimming pools when not in use)
- Repair screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.

# **Hurricanes: be ready!**

We are currently in the midst of a very active hurricane season.

This is a reminder that everyone should be prepared to survive on their own for at least 72 hours. Supplies sell out fast once a storm has been forecasted, **so it is important to prepare ahead of time.**

Emergency officials will be communicating with county residents using <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Twitter</u>. My office will also be posting on my <u>Facebook</u> page.

**Emergency App:** There is a free emergency app, <u>PBC</u> <u>DART</u>, that provides vital information such as storm surge, evacuation areas, flood zones, shelter locations, grocery and building supply stores and gas stations with emergency generators.

**Shelters**: A hurricane evacuation shelter is a refuge of last resort, a place to go if you can't stay at home, with a relative, friend, co-worker or at a nearby hotel.

Palm Beach County and the school district manage public shelters. Shelters will operate under CDC guidelines (social distancing, facial coverings, etc.) and with basic first aid only. Each person is **assigned 20 square feet of space** and must bring supplies such as bedding, blankets, inflatable mattresses, water, medicine, baby food, water, and toiletries. # Census takers going door-to-door

The county's census response rate is only approximately 60 percent. If you are one of the 600,000 residents yet to respond, please take a minute to complete the census now.

Census takers are now visiting homes of residents throughout the county who have not responded yet.

How to identify a census taker:

- Check they have a valid photo ID badge (with a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark and an expiration date).
- They may carry bags and other equipment with the Census Bureau logo.
- If there are any doubts, you can contact the Census Bureau at 844-330-2020 to speak with a representative.

All census takers will be wearing masks and social distancing.

To avoid fraud, the Census Bureau will never ask for:

- your Social Security number
- your bank account or credit card numbers
- money or donations

# **Boca Raton Inlet bridge closure**

# Full Phase 1 openings in effect

The county remains in Full Phase One openings. As a reminder, the following businesses are **not currently allowed to open**: bars, nightclubs, adult entertainment establishments, strip clubs, hookah, cigar and other smoking bars and lounges, tanning salons, bowling alleys, arcades, playhouses, concert houses, movie theaters, auditoriums, indoor entertainment venues, tattoo parlors, and body piercing parlors.

Just recently, acupuncture venues and massage parlors were added to the "approved list" of Full Phase One openings.

# Covid app available





All CombatCOVID app users who have been in close proximity to a COVID-19 positive person will be notified by a push notification recommending they get tested immediately, without revealing anyone's personal identity. Suggested locations for testing are also provided.

Unlike other apps, CombatCOVID will never use GPS or location notification in its architecture. The app user's privacy and identity are protected. No names, email addresses, locations or personal identifying information is required. There is never any location or identity information acquired by CombatCOVID.

Your device's phone number is encrypted and never shared with anyone, including local health officials. All data and information about a device in close proximity to another device is ONLY stored on the device.

**Testing sites** 

#### **Homebound Resident Testing**

Residents eligible for the new testing option include homebound elderly or individuals with disabilities who are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 and cannot leave their homes to access one of the drive-thru or walk-up test collection sites.

Residents who believe they are eligible for the in-home testing option should call the Palm Beach County Emergency Information Center (EIC) at **561-712-6400** for a pre-qualifying assessment. The testing line is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

#### **Boca Raton at FAU**

The drive-thru testing site is located at the FAU Tech Runway on the north end of the FAU campus. The address is 901 NW 35th Street, Boca Raton, 33431. Residents should enter the testing site from Spanish River Boulevard.

Appointments are required. To make an appointment, call 1-800-209-7919 Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Testing is available to anyone over the age of 12, with or without COVID-19 symptoms.

#### **South County Civic Center**

The drive-thru site at 16700 Jog Road, Delray Beach, is by appointment only. Call 1-800-209-7919. Testing is available to anyone over the age of 12 with or without symptoms.

Drive-thru testing is available by appointment only Tuesday through Saturday between 8 a.m. and noon. Call 561-642-

1000. **Any age, need not be symptomatic.** Antibody testing is also available by appointment only.

#### Assistance for rent and utilities
