DEO UPDATES AS OF SEPTEMBER 1

- Just last week, the Governor applied for the Lost Wages Assistance Program (LWAP). This program, authorized by a memorandum from President Trump, provides additional temporary benefits for individuals who are eligible for Reemployment Assistance for weeks of unemployment ending on or after Aug. 1, 2020.
- Pending federal approval, this will allow Florida to offer an additional \$300 per week to eligible Reemployment Assistance claimants. To be eligible for this benefit, claimants must be currently receiving at least \$100 in an approved Reemployment Assistance program weekly benefit amount and must certify that they are unemployed or partially unemployed due to the disruptions caused by COVID-19. Pending approval of Florida's application, payments will be retroactive to August 1, 2020.
- The Department is currently preparing to implement the LWA program to ensure eligible Floridians receive the additional benefits as quickly as possible. More information can be found here.
- DEO will be conducting nightly maintenance to the CONNECT system to process claims and payments. CONNECT will be available from 8 a.m. to 7:59 p.m. daily. This schedule does not affect individuals who wish to file a new claim. Individuals can file a new claim 24 hours a day, seven days per week at www.FloridaJobs.org and select "File a Claim."

School Meals During Distance Learning

Starting August 31, student grab-and-go meals will be available at <u>174 District-operated and charter schools</u> across the county. Distributions will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Meals are \$2.05 for elementary school and \$2.30 for middle and high school. Reduced-price meals are \$.40. No cash will be accepted at meal distribution.

Families should establish and fund a <u>School Cash Online</u> account to pay for meals at pick up. Breakfast is free for every student.

Three days' worth of meals will be provided on Tuesdays and two days' worth of meals will be distributed on Thursdays. Due to the upcoming holiday week only two days' worth of meals will be provided on September 1st.

Families may qualify for free and reduced lunch. Eligibility for free and reduced-price meals is based on household size and income. To apply for free and reduced lunch, <u>click here</u>. Only one application is needed per family.

A valid Student ID badge, student number, or bar code letter (that can be found in your <u>child's student portal</u>) is required to pick up all meals. An email was sent to all students, and all parents with registered emails, with the bar code letter. A mask is also required for meal pick up.

You do not need to visit your child's school for food distribution but instead can visit a location nearest you. Pick up is either in the bus loop or parent pick up of the school. For more information, please visit palmbeachschools.org/schoolmeals.

Mass Care Shelters

Mass care shelters provide life-sustaining services to disaster survivors. Even though mass care shelters often provide water, food, medicine and basic sanitary facilities, you should plan to take your emergency supply kit with you so you will have the supplies you need. Mass care sheltering can involve thing with many people in a confined space, which can be difficult and unpleasant.

Preparing for hurricane season in the midst of a pandemic is something none of us has ever had to do. Shelters will be setup to accommodate social distancing. Families will not have more space, but spaces between families will be larger. Be prepared to take cleaning items with you like soap, hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes or general household cleaning supplies to disinfect surfaces.

Maintain at least 6 feet of space between you and people who are not in your immediate family and have facial coverings with you for anyone ages 2 and above in your family.

Refugios de Cuidado Masivo

Locations for CARES Act Rent and Utilities Document Drop-off and Application Assistance

The PBC Community Services Department (CSD) has added new locations to help applicants who have submitted CARES Act applications and need assistance with uploading pending documentation, verifying eligibility and/or processing the application only.

Library Drop-Off Services

- Applicants with pending documentation may also submit their documents at Palm Beach County Libraries. Some library locations may have limited inperson services. Library staff will only receive documents for pending applications. Assistance with applying and/or submitting applications for the program is not offered at any Palm Beach County Branch Library. Palm Beach County Community Services Department to Temporarily Suspend Rental and Utility Assistance Applications

On Sept. 1, 2020, the Palm Beach County Community Services Department (CSD) will temporarily suspend the acceptance of rental and utility applications to allow sufficient time to process applications currently in the queue. The county will reopen the application portal in October if funds are still available. Applications must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. on Aug. 31 in order to be processed.

Currently, more than 3,400 applications have been submitted for a total request of approximately \$8 million. An additional 3,300 applications are in draft status. Individuals who have already submitted applications can check their status at www.pbcgov.com/clientservicessearch.

To date, Palm Beach County has processed close to 1,000 rental and utility payments totaling over \$1.4 million. The review process has been completed for an additional 360 payments totaling approximately \$560,000. There are 620 applications currently pending due to missing documents, 320 have been denied, and 1,120 applications are under review.

Youth Services and Early Learning Coalition of Palm Beach County Provide Child Care Scholarships to Working Families Amid COVID-19 Pandemic

The Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners will provide funding through its Youth Services Department to the Early Learning Coalition of Palm Beach County to provide child care scholarships for qualifying families with school age children grades K-5 who may be participating in the School District of Palm Beach County's distant learning curriculum.

Monies are made available through the county's CARES Act funding to meet the need of access to childcare services for those families affected by financial difficulties due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The scholarship will prioritize homeless children, children residing in families who work or attend school during the hours of the School District of Palm Beach County's distance learning and have a household income at or below 200% of federal poverty quidelines.

Additionally, Palm Beach County Youth Services procured 1,000 headsets to be supplied to child care centers allowing students to concentrate on their individual lessons in a congregate setting.

Emergency Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly (EHEAP)

- » Florida's EHEAP helps low-income households, with at least one person age 60 and older, when the households are experiencing a home energy emergency and are unable to pay their FPL bill.
- » Households can receive this type of financial assistance up to twice a year.
- » For more information on eligibility requirements and to apply for assistance, contact your local Aging and Disability Resource Center, call the Elder Helpline at 800-963-5337. or reach out to a community agency EHEAP provider in your area.
