Each day of the week leading up to America Recycle Day (Nov 15), the Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County will spotlight waste topics including:

Tuesday, Nov. 10 – *Home Chemical and Recycling Center* – What dangers might be lurking in your home? Find out and discover how to drop them off.

Wednesday, Nov. 11 – *Heavy Equipment Showcase* – Get up close and personal with some of the loaders, dozers and cranes used to move 17 million pounds of garbage and recyclables each day.

Thursday, Nov. 12 – *Trekking Through the Trails* – Check out the newly-installed signs on the SWA's Rookery Trail and discover what animals you may see while exploring the SWA Greenway Trail System.

Friday, Nov. 13 – *SWA Green Schools Awards* – The winners of the SWA Green School Awards will showcase the innovative ways Palm Beach County schools Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Rethink their waste!

And the SWA recycled or safely disposed of more than 4.1M pounds of home chemicals, including:

About the SWA

The Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County is a Dependent Special District that was created by the Florida Legislature in 1975. Since then, the SWA has developed an award-winning integrated solid waste management system to handle the county's waste and recyclables. We call ourselves AWAY: whether you throw it, recycle it or flush it AWAY, we put your waste to work. Each year, we:

- Process almost 100,000 tons of <u>recyclables</u> each year
- Burn approximately 1.8 million tons of trash each year to generate electricity at renewable energy facilities
- Produce enough electricity to power approximately 74,000 homes
- Recycle more than 150,000 tons of <u>wastewater treatment residuals</u> (sludge from flushes) into environmentally-friendly fertilizer
- Collect water off of the roofs of Renewable Energy Facility 2 and store it in a 2 million gallon cistern, which is used as part of the energy
 making process
