

New Redaction Requirements Now in Effect

All filers of circuit civil, county civil and small claims court documents are now solely responsible for ensuring that confidential information is redacted or is identified for redaction.

In <u>Opinion 20-1765</u>, the Florida Supreme Court amended Rule 2.420 requiring the filer to be solely responsible for identifying confidential information in small claims, county civil and most circuit civil court documents.

These changes, which took effect on July 1, **do not apply** to juvenile, family, guardianship, probate or criminal cases.
