## HURRICANE DEFINITIONS:

- HURRICANE WATCH: Hurricane conditions (sustained winds of at least 74 mph) are possible in the area within 36 hours.
- HURRICANE WARNING: Hurricane-force conditions (sustained winds of at least 74 mph) are expected in the area within 24 hours.
- CATAGORY 1: Minimal 74-95 MPH winds.
- CATAGORY 2: Moderate 96-110 MPH winds.
- CATAGORY 3: Extensive -111-130 MPH winds.
- CATAGORY 4: Extreme 131- 155 MPH winds.
- CATAGORY 5: Catastrophic - 155+ MPH winds.
