# 2022 Legislation Updates

At this time, I have now filed <u>13 bills</u> and several more are in the queue:

SB 388: Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion SB 388 will make Florida a national exemplar in reconciling inequities and historical injustices by creating the executive Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. The legislation directs the Office, headed by the Chief Diversity Officer, to coordinate with agencies and create a strategic plan that establishes equity across state government, requires a review of agency policies and programs to assess whether underserved communities have unequal access to benefits and opportunities, calls for increased state investment in underserved communities within the Governor's recommended budget, and requires implicit bias training in Florida's agencies.

SB 436: Driving Under the Influence Drug impaired driving is a growing problem nationwide and Florida is no exception. Florida is one of only six states where a driving under the influence with a combination of substances is not totally illegal. SB 436 seeks to change that by broadening the DUI statutes to include any and all impairing substances, or combination(s) thereof, in order for a drug not to necessarily be listed on a controlled substances list in order for the crime of driving impaired to be prosecuted.

SB 558: Court Recordings

This legislation requires that any court recording be electronically or stenographically recorded, made available to the parties for purchase, and at no cost to an indigent party seeking to appeal the court's ruling. The legislation stemmed from years of hard work with PBC NOW and "Families Against Court Travesties" (FACTS) and would help ensure all people have fair and equitable access to our court system, indigent or not.

Nearly one million acres of coastal estuaries and nine thousand miles of Florida's streams and rivers are impaired with fecal indicator bacteria, but no statutory requirement exists to inform the public of this threat to their health. Our bill will require county health departments to post conspicuous signage at public bathing places which are impaired for fecal coliform bacteria.

# **Committee Week Update**

We are now at the halfway point of committee weeks. As you read this, we are traveling back to Tallahassee for our fourth committee week. The weeks of November 15th and November 29th remain.

Additionally, we are awaiting more details on the special session being called by the Governor, seeking to halt any vaccination requirements on small businesses. To clearly state my position, I am opposed to the purpose for this special session.



# Statement on Surgeon General Nominee Dr. Ladapo

I will strongly oppose Dr. Joseph Ladapo's nomination during the Senate confirmation process.

The COVID-19 pandemic has exacted a horrible toll on our country and state. I believe that our only way through it – and through any difficult challenge facing our society – is by putting politics aside and coming together. But Governor DeSantis decided early on he would politicize the pandemic and further divide our state. He's politicized mask use in our schools and businesses, even though it's conventional science and proven to reduce transmission. He's politicized vaccines through disinformation and attacked the Biden Administration for simply having a strong plan to end the pandemic. He's done nothing to protect lives and cares more about culture wars and outrage politics than what Floridians actually lose sleep over.

The latest manifestation of his war on public health is the nomination of Dr. Ladapo for Surgeon General. With just weeks on the job as interim Surgeon General, he's peddled in the same vaccine and mask conspiracies as the Governor, even refusing to wear a mask in the office of my friend and colleague, Senator Tina Polsky, who is battling cancer. Nothing could be more disrespectful and dangerous. I've opposed his nomination since it was announced, and following his recalcitrant outburst at my colleague, I'm only further convinced he is undeserving of his post.

# Palm Beach County is a Leader in Federal Spending by Directly Helping Families Dealing with COVID Crises and More Assistance is Available with ERAP2 Intake

Palm Beach County (PBC) has started accepting applications for ERAP2 allocations. Individuals experiencing a crisis during this pandemic, which has led to a financial impact, can apply for rental assistance at: <a href="https://www.RentalAssistancePBC.org">www.RentalAssistancePBC.org</a>.

To qualify for aid, applicants must rent in PBC. At least one person in the home must either prove loss of income directly or indirectly due to COVID-19 or experience any crisis during this pandemic. Households must also be at or below 80% of the Area Median

Income (AMI).

Individuals qualifying for unemployment who demonstrate a risk of homelessness or housing instability and/or have incurred significant costs due to COVID-19 may also be eligible.

Priority is for the unemployed or those who have received an eviction notice. If a tenant's eviction is filed in court, the renter will be referred to the Legal Aid Society Palm Beach County (LAS) or Florida Rural Legal Services (FRLS). LAS and FRLS will work to provide free legal assistance and representation in landlord/tenant matters. Those eligible may receive assistance with past due payments.

In order to apply for rental and/or relocation assistance:

- evidence of COVID-19 direct or indirect impact
- evidence of crisis that impacts the inability to pay rent and utilities
- evidence of risk of homelessness or housing instability
- evidence of income eligibility
- valid government issued ID
- Social Security Number for all household members with a copy of applicant's social security card required. Case Manager may require copies of all household members' social security cards.

Rental support may be paid up to three months in advance and income must be recertified for each three-month period.

For rental assistance, landlords must be registered as vendors with PBC. Utility assistance is for electric, water, gas, sewer, trash removal and energy costs for eligible rental households only.

Applicants must submit all required documentation to expedite approval.

In-person assistance and mobile outreach are available for individuals who:

- lack computers or internet connection; or,
- lack the skills needed to use a computer; or
- have language barriers or developmental disabilities; or
- face other barriers preventing access to the online application portal for rental assistance.

Palm Beach County is one of a handful of Florida counties who exceeded the required 65% obligated funding threshold for ERAP1 by the September 30<sup>th</sup> deadline. Thus far, we have expended 85% of the direct service dollars.



The monoclonal antibody treatments are available to individuals 12 years of age and older who have been diagnosed with COVID-19 or who have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 and are at high risk for severe illness and hospitalization. The monoclonal antibody treatments are available at no cost to eligible individuals.

The antibodies help the immune system recognize and respond effectively to the

virus. According to the <u>treatment guidelines</u>, they should be administered as soon as possible after diagnosis.
