Legislation Sponsored By Representative Slosberg

1. A Bill establishes guilt for sexual assault of an intoxicated person even if the offender did not cause the intoxication.
2. HB 339/ SB 558 requires Family Courts to record court proceedings concerning child custody and child support, and provide a transcript of the proceedings to a impoverished parent who wants to appeal.
3. On the morning of September 23, 2021 in Fort Pierce, 10-year old student Yaceny Berenice Rodriguez Gonzalez was killed by a hit and run driver who failed to stop behind a school bus with its long arm stop sign extended and reds light flashing. HB 179 authorizes school district to install cameras on the long arm stop sign to capture whether cars stop when approaching, and law enforcement use of the technology.
4. A Bill that adds to the Florida seat belt law to require every passenger in a motor vehicle to use a safety belt, regardless of age and where seated in the vehicle.
5. HB 127 prohibits the use of cell phones in a handheld manner in the immediate vicinity of first responders who are in the line of duty.
6. A Bill to prohibit a person from chaining a domestic dog or cat unless attending to the animal who remains visible to the person at all times while chained.

7. HB 321 allows a condominium association to change its by-laws to allow for a transfer fee in the sale of condominium for the exclusive use of those funds for reserves for condominium structure maintenance.
8. A Resolution designating the week of April 24, 2022 to May 1, 2022 as the “Days of Remembrance” for victims of the Holocaust.
9. An Appropriation for the Ruth & Norman Rales Jewish Family Services, Inc. for senior transportation.
10. An Appropriation for “Grey Team” to implement health and wellness programs for U.S. military active-duty and veterans to heal all the wounds of war.
