Rep. Frankel Statement on Russian Aggression Against Ukraine, President Biden's Response

West Palm Beach, FL – Congresswoman Lois Frankel (FL-21) released the following statement in response to Russia's aggression against Ukraine and President Biden's announcement that the United States would join the European Union and the United Kingdom in establishing new financial sanctions on Russia.

"Vladimir Putin's hostility in Ukraine is not only a threat to the sovereignty and security of the Ukrainian people, but to all those who want to live in a world where free and democratic nations are not threatened by foreign aggression," **said Rep. Frankel**. "In 1994, Ukraine voluntarily gave up the world's third largest arsenal of nuclear weapons in exchange for security guarantees from the U.S., UK, and Russia. Putin trampled on that agreement in 2014 when he annexed Crimea and provoked a separatist war in Eastern Ukraine, and is now being even more brazen with his latest incursion. The Biden Administration is right to work in lockstep with our NATO allies to levy targeted financial sanctions against Russia and to insist that more consequences will follow if Putin does not deescalate his military aggression."

Rep. Frankel Announces Nearly \$2 Million for Palm Beach County Food, Rental Assistance Programs

This critical funding provided by the *American Rescue Plan* will help the county supplement social services programs that feed, shelter, and provide other services

to vulnerable populations in the community. As rent continues to rise and affordable housing becomes even more limited, this assistance is a critical opportunity to help keep families in their homes in the coming months. Representative Lois Frankel joined Mayor Shelly Petrolia for a tour of the City's Water Treatment Plant on Tuesday, February 8.

"Access to clean, safe, and affordable water is imperative to our health and our economy," said Rep. Frankel. "The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law is a historic investment in our country's infrastructure with billions of dollars dedicated to improving water systems."



The City's new water treatment plant, estimated to be completed in 2026, will ensure a state-of-the-art water treatment process, advance the City's monitoring and control systems, improve water pressure, and serve the needs of the community for years to come.

"The City of Delray Beach has been awarded \$10,956,323 from the federal government's American Rescue Plan Act and those funds will help ensure our city has the ability to improve the quality, safety, and reliability of our infrastructure systems to increase our sustainability for years to come," said Mayor Shelly Petrolia. Local Governments Now Eligible for New Flood Prevention Funding Through Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act



West Palm Beach, FL – Representative Lois Frankel (FL-21) hosted an in-person press conference to announce new funding opportunities through the *Infrastructure, Investment, and Jobs Act* to bolster flooding and disaster mitigation efforts in Palm Beach County.

Flooding, including King Tides, can cause damage to roads and buildings, and hurt local businesses by keeping customers away while the streets and sidewalks are unusable. States and local governments will be able to apply through the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) and Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) grant programs to build new, more resilient infrastructure that can help reduce the risk of flood damage and bring costs down. Some eligible projects include refurbishing sea walls, hurricane retrofitting, sand dune restoration, and more. Watch the conference here.
