# SWA's May Household Hazardous Waste Tip ~Old hurricane supplies can be hazardous~

Hurricane season starts June 1, and many of our Palm Beach County neighbors are making sure they are prepared. As you update hurricane supplies, keep in mind that some items should not be placed in the garbage, but instead, be brought to one of the SWA's Home Chemical and Recycling Centers.

Supplies requiring special disposal include:

- gasoline and oil from generators
- propane tanks
- rechargeable batteries from electronics or flashlights

These items (and other home hazards) can be dropped off for free by Palm Beach County residents at any of the <a href="Home Chemical and Recycling Centers">Home Chemical and Recycling Centers</a> listed below, where they will be recycled or disposed of properly.

Commercial interests should call 561-687-1100 for disposal options.

In the last fiscal year, Palm Beach County residents safely disposed of or recycled more than 4.9M pounds of home chemicals. This included:

- 95,000 pounds of fuel
- 570,000 pounds of used oil and oil filters
- 230,000 pounds of gas cylinders/propane tanks
- 116,000 pounds of batteries

The Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County is a Dependent Special District that was created by the Florida Legislature in 1975. Since then, the SWA has developed an award-winning integrated solid waste management system to handle the county's waste and recyclables. We call ourselves AWAY: whether you throw it, recycle it or flush it AWAY, we put your waste to work. Each year, we:

- Process more than 100,000 tons of recyclables each year
- Combust approximately 1.8 million tons of trash each year to generate electricity at renewable energy facilities
- Produce enough electricity to power approximately 74,000 homes, about the number of homes in Boca Raton and Palm Beach Gardens
- Recycle more than 150,000 tons of wastewater treatment residuals (sludge from flushes) into environmentally-friendly fertilizer
- Safely dispose of more than 4 million pounds of home hazards a year
- Collect water off of the roofs of <u>Renewable Energy Facility 2</u> and store it in a 2 million gallon cistern, which is used as part of the energy making process
