Legislative & Budget Update

Since our end of session newsletter was e-blasted, two of my bills were signed into law by the Governor and one has been transmitted to the Governor for a signature. Another bill, <u>SB 1052</u>, was absorbed into the tax package, <u>HB 7063</u>, which has also been signed into law.

SB 144: Lactation Spaces

It was an honor and pleasure to work closely with my House sponsor, Rep. Ashley Gantt, and FAWL, to ensure the passage of SB 144 into law. Nursing women requiring a safe, hygienic and private space to breastfeed or pump will now be able to do so. This is a great bill for Florida women entering and working in our courthouses, whether as judges, attorneys, jurors, personnel, visitors or in any other capacity.

SB 130: Greyson's Law

Having Greyson's signed into law is by far one of the proudest moments in my 13 year legislative career. The impact of this legislation in protecting, and likely even, saving the lives of children will be long-lasting and far-reaching. There are so many people to thank along the way to ensure this bill was passed and signed. Ultimately, we are grateful to Greyson "Gig's" Mom, Ali, for her tenacity and persistence. Greyson, this is for you.



HB 7063: Taxation

Each year the Legislature passes a tax package, sometimes enshrining permanent

sales tax holidays and oftentimes, simply including a one-time annual exemption. A frequently occurring tax exemption is on disaster preparedness items, such as generators, flashlights and batteries (certain restrictions apply and more info follows below in the "Hurricane Season 2023" section). The "Freedom Summer" exemption was put into place again, exempting tickets to concerts, sporting events, movies, museums, plays, ballets, musical theater performances, fairs, festivals and other cultural events. For more than 20 years, Floridians have seen the back to school sales tax holiday, which exempts certain computers/laptops, clothing and other school supplies. This year the exemption applies both in the summer (July 24-August 6) and next winter (January 1-14, 2024). The details of all of these sales tax holidays, when they run and what is included can be found on the <u>Florida</u> Department of Revenue's home page.

Within the tax package, I was pleased that the substance of my bill, SB 1052, was retained. In that provision, totally and permanently disabled veterans or their surviving spouses may receive a pro-rated refund of property tax for the portion of the year that they own a new homestead property, even if they had not received this exemption on another homestead property in that same year.

<u>HB 965: Driver License, Identification Card, and Voter Vehicle Registration</u> <u>Applications</u> - "Best Buddies"

This legislation will provide for Floridians applying for the first time, or renewing their driver's license/ID and/or motor vehicle registration, to "opt in" for a \$1 voluntary contribution to <u>Best Buddies International</u>, an international nonprofit organization dedicated to establishing a global volunteer movement that creates opportunities for friendships, integrated employment and leadership development for those with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). The bill was transmitted to the Governor on May 23. The Governor has 15 days (June 7) in which to sign, not sign (still goes into law) or veto.

Hurricane Season 2023

Hurricane season starts June 1, and now is the time to stock up on the supplies you need to weather any storm that comes our way. Florida's Disaster Preparedness Tax-Free Holiday has been expanded to offer a total of four weeks of savings. The holiday began this past Saturday and goes through Friday, June 9. Another window starts Saturday, August 26 and goes through Friday, September 8.

This year, the list of tax-free items eligible was expanded to include household consumable items. In addition to flashlights, radios, tarps, batteries, coolers and generators, Floridians can now also save on paper towels, toilet paper, dish detergent, dryer sheets and more. SWA 4R AMBASSADOR PROGRAM TEACHES KIDS TO BE ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDS THROUGH PROPER WASTE CHOICES

The Solid Waste Authority (SWA) of Palm Beach County is looking for students to participate in a one-week Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and ReThink (4R) adventure into the world of waste. This year's program will take place June 5-9. During this week, students will engage in hands-on activities and labs focusing on the environment from an integrated solid waste management perspective.

After students learn about the concept of AWAY, they'll graduate as official SWA 4R Ambassadors. With this credential, they're encouraged to teach their family and friends about how their waste can affect our environment. They'll also be able to explain how individuals can Recycle Right and be mindful of their day-to-day choices and actions to reduce, reuse and rethink their waste.

Students will go behind-the-scenes at all SWA facilities, including:

- a Home Chemical and Recycling Center
- the Landfill
- the Recovered Materials Processing (recycling) Facility
- Renewable Energy Facility 2 (the cleanest, greenest, most efficient waste-toenergy plant in the world!)
- a Transfer Station

- Utilities
- the SWA Greenway Trail System (300 acres of natural area with six miles of trails) Students will also visit the Authority's community partners, which include Resource Depot, Loxahatchee River District and Grassy Waters Preserve.

Participant Requirements:

Students interested in the 4R Ambassador Summer Program should meet the following criteria:

- Completed grades 6, 7 or 8
- Membership in a school club (Environmental, SECME, Garden, etc.)
- Science teacher's recommendation in the form of a letter

The "cost" to participate in the 4R Ambassador Summer Program is an old electronic device, which will be recycled.

Applicants will be reviewed on a first-come, first-served basis.
