Board unanimously votes to reduce the county's millage rate

Millage rate



Homesteaded property owners in Palm Beach County will pay less in county property taxes next year.

At Tuesday's Board of County Commissioners meeting, the board voted unanimously to lower the millage rate from 4.715 to 4.5, a reduction of nearly 5%. Property values have risen substantially, usually resulting in a higher tax bill. But for homesteaded properties, the annual increase in assessed value is capped at 3%, and since the decrease in millage is larger than the increase in value, these homeowners will pay less in property taxes to the county.

Owners of properties that are not homesteaded will also see a reduction in the millage rate. However, depending on the increase in the property's valuation, there may not be an actual tax reduction. Non-homesteaded property value increases are capped at 10%.

Note that depending on where you live, other taxes are levied on your property (by a city, school district, water management district, health care district and other taxing districts).
