Floridians Rescued

On Sunday, Oct. 15, more than 270 Americans stranded in Israel landed safely in Tampa. The mission was a joint effort through the Florida Emergency Operations Center and several nonprofits, including the Tampa-based nonprofit Project DYNAMO.

Project DYNAMO is a U.S. veteran international rescue that conducts global and domestic operations in "The Grey Space," where the U.S. government lacks access or a presence to rescue the most vulnerable populations, including hostages and detained Americans.

As Vice Mayor of Palm Beach County, I had the privilege of touring the Caridad Center in Boynton Beach, the largest free clinic in Florida. Co-founder Connie Berry and Chief Development Officer Lisa Kronhaus led the tour.

In 2005, the Migrant Association of South Florida changed its name to Caridad Center in honor of Caridad Asensio, one of the two women who founded the Migrant Association of South Florida in 1989, and also to reflect the changes in the client population and to be more inclusive of the agency's three-fold mission of health, education and outreach.

The center provides medical, dental and vision care for the uninsured and underserved children and families of Palm Beach County. In addition to the on-site services, a mobile vision van is now being used to offer access to those who cannot afford transportation to the center.

Caridad Center relies on volunteers to help its mission of serving and helping the uninsured and underserved in Palm Beach County. They have needs for psychiatrists, podiatrists, rheumatologists and Creole-speaking interpreters. If you are interested in volunteering, call 561-853-1621.

Tai chi, also known as Tai Ji Quan, is a series of gentle physical exercises and stretches. Each posture flows into the next without pause, ensuring your body is in constant motion. Tai chi is sometimes described as meditation in motion because it promotes serenity through gentle movements while connecting the mind and body.

Originally developed in ancient China for self-defense, tai chi evolved into a graceful exercise for stress reduction and helps with various other health conditions.

Tai chi has many different styles. Each style has its subtle emphasis on various tai chi principles and methods. As a result, there are more than 100 possible movements and positions with tai chi. Regardless of the variation, all tai chi forms include rhythmic patterns of movement coordinated with breathing to help you achieve a sense of inner calm.

Information on Holiday Waste Collection in Unincorporated Palm Beach County

There are only two observed holidays during which residents in unincorporated Palm Beach County will not receive garbage service:

- Thanksgiving Day: Thursday, Nov. 23, 2023
- Christmas Day: Monday, Dec. 25, 2023

There will be normal scheduled collection services for unincorporated residents on the following holidays:

- Veteran's Day: Saturday, Nov. 11, 2023
 Christmas Eve: Sunday, Dec. 24, 2023
 New Year's Eve: Sunday, Dec. 31, 2023
- New Year's Day: Monday, Jan. 1, 2024

If you live in one of Palm Beach County's 39 municipalities, contact your municipality directly for their holiday collection schedule. A <u>list of municipal</u> contacts can be found online.

If residents in unincorporated Palm Beach County have any garbage or recyclable collection questions or concerns, they should contact SWA Customer Service at 561-697-2700, 866-792-4636 or contactcis@swa.org.
