


Every year on Nov. 11, our nation unites to observe Veterans Day, a day dedicated to expressing our gratitude and support for the brave men and women who have served in the armed forces. However, we must also acknowledge the physical and mental health challenges veterans may face long after their service. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs reports that in 2020, a staggering 6,146 veterans took their own lives. That translates to an average of 16.8 veterans lost every day. When adjusted for population, age and sex differences, the suicide rate among veterans was 57.3% higher than that of non-veteran U.S. adults. These statistics are a stark reminder that our veterans need our continued support, compassion and resources. Let's commit ourselves to ensuring veterans receive the comprehensive assistance and resources necessary to transition to civilian life.

As we come together to salute and recognize the bravery of our heroes on this Veterans Day, let their patriotism and selflessness serve as a source of inspiration for us all.
